GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- 10th graders : minimum 50 credits to be on track
- 11th graders : minimum 110 credits to be on track

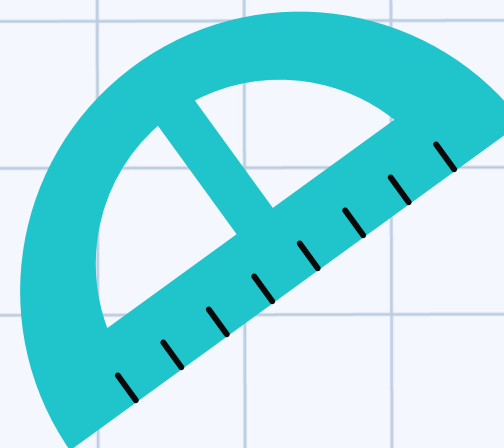
If your student is in 11th grade and not on track, counselors will sign them up for after school credit recovery

- Students will achieve all 230 credits if they pass all 6 classes each school year.
- Graduation Status and Transcript can be viewed in Aeries portal

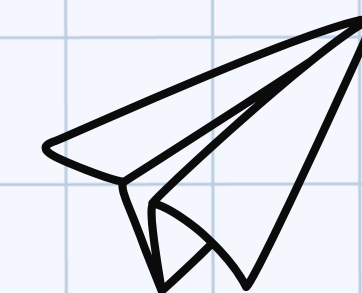
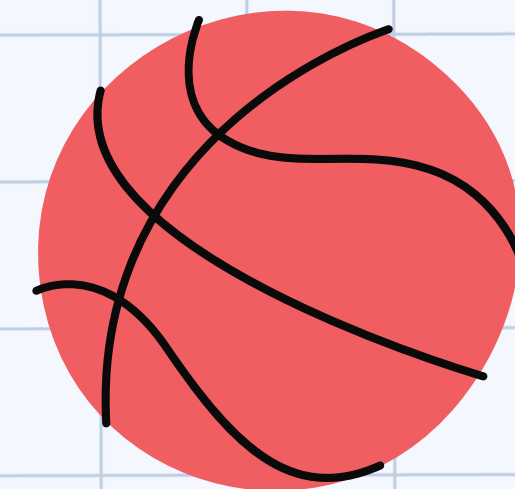

A-G REQUIREMENTS

- A-G requirements allow students to be eligible to apply for a 4 year university right out of high school
- Key differences from grad requirements include:
 - Grade requirement of C- or higher in all A-G coursework
 - 2 years of the same foreign language
 - 3 years of Math required
 - In order to be competitive, following the recommended coursework is advised
- Students may do grade improvement through summer school or after school credit recovery should they received a grade lower than a C- in A-G coursework

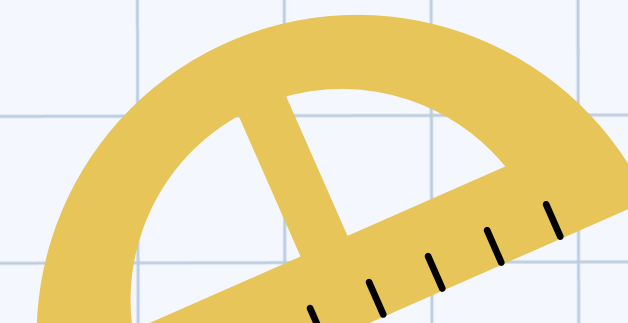
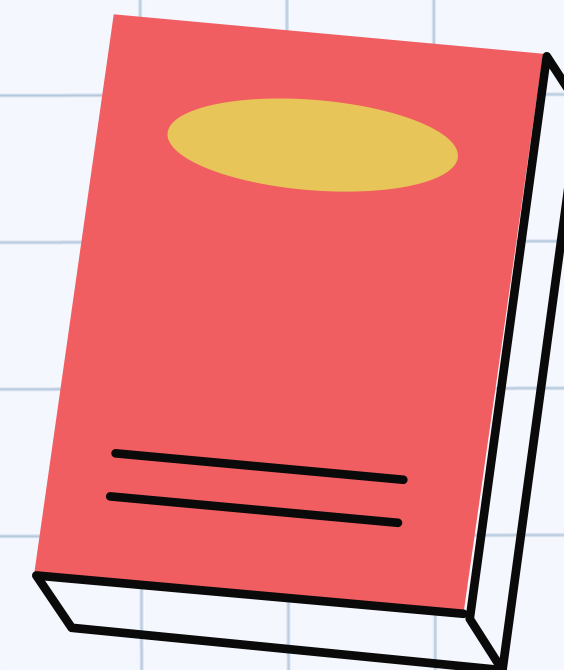
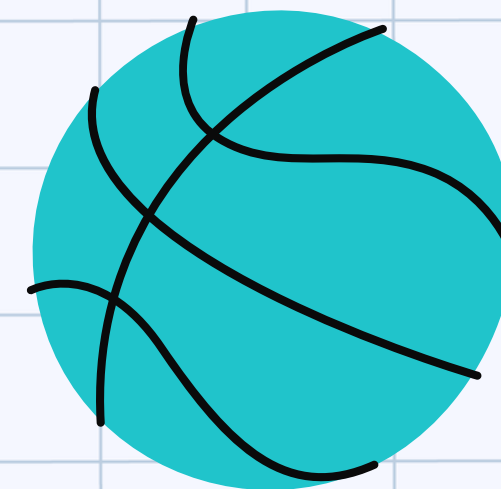

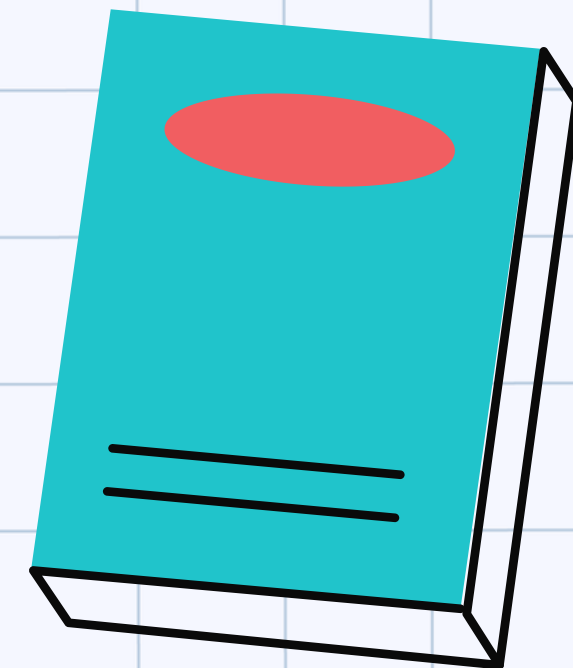
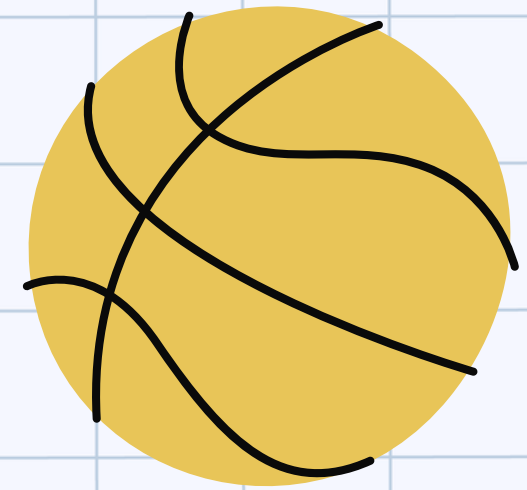
WHERE SHOULD MY 10TH GRADER BE?

- Have a minimum of 50 credits completed
- Beginning to think about plans after high school
- Planning what courses they will be taking in 11th grade should they plan to apply to 4 year universities
- Getting involved in extracurricular activities (clubs, sports, community-based work, etc.)
- Start exploring what field they would like to pursue
- Log in to californiacolleges.edu to familiarize themselves and check a-g eligibility, career interest tests are available also
- Focus on academics, especially if they intend on taking rigorous courses in 11th grade
- Beginning to do research on schools that offer potential major options



WHERE SHOULD MY 11TH GRADER BE?

- Should have a minimum of 110 credits completed
- Have an idea of what their postsecondary plans are
- Understand their A-G eligibility status
- Getting involved with extracurricular activities if they haven't already. Ex: At BHS, community work, internships, jobs, volunteering, etc.
- Gathering information for their resume/prag sheet that will be needed for letters of recommendation during 12th grade
- If applying to competitive schools taking rigorous courses such as AP's and Honors
- Understand their A-G eligibility status
- Getting familiar with californiacolleges.edu (CCGI)
- Signing up for the PSAT
- Researching schools that provide their major
- College Visits/Tours

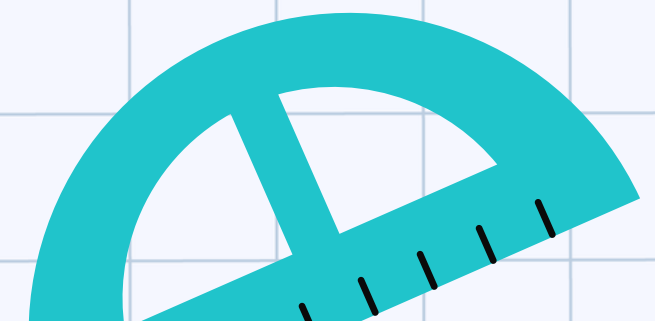
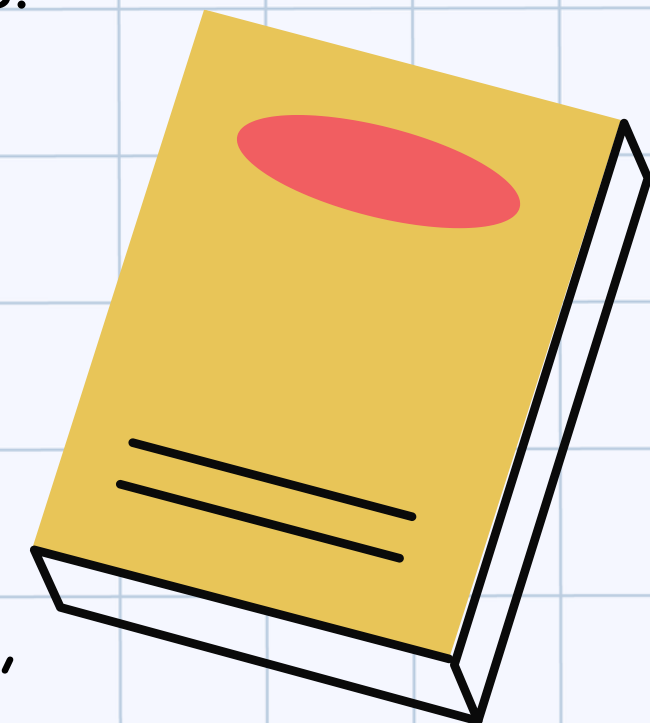
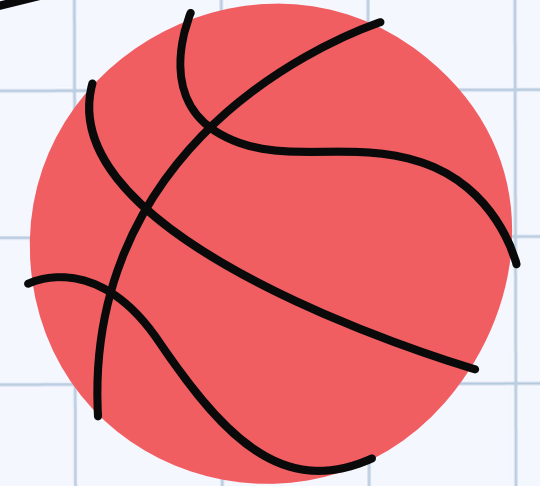
- On students and families to enroll, these courses do not go on the BHS transcript

12TH GRADE REDUCED SCHEDULE POLICY

To qualify for a 5 period senior year schedule a student must:

Section 1:

- Have completed at least 180 credits by the end of junior year
- Have a minimum cumulative 2.0 GPA
- Be able to complete all remaining BUSD graduation requirements within 5 periods each semester

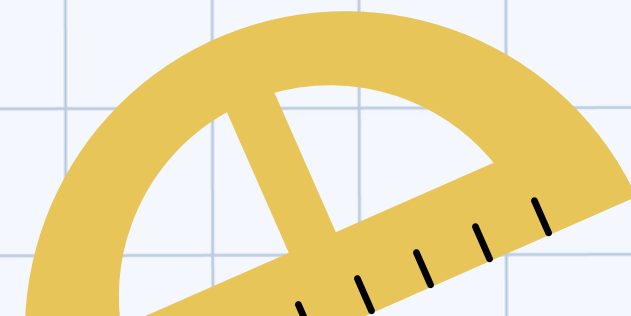
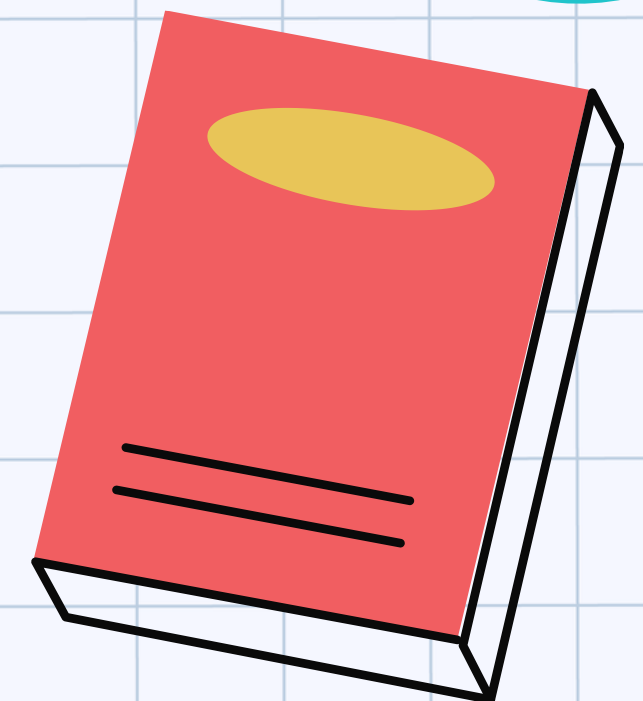
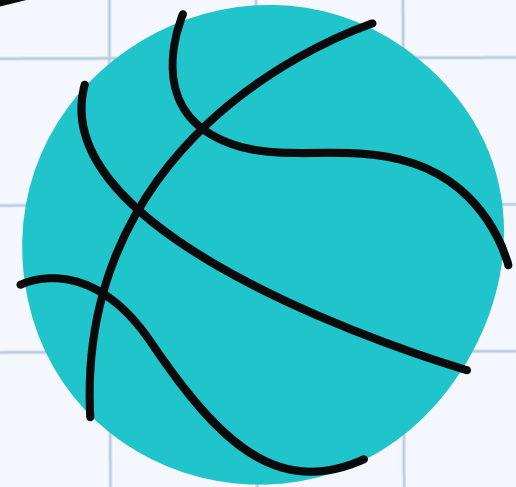
Section 2:

- **(2A)** Meet or exceed "Standard Met" level on the Grade 11 CAASPP/SBAC assessment in either English Language Arts or Mathematics

AND

- **(2B)** Satisfy at least one college or career readiness pathway:
 - A-G Eligibility: Be on track to complete all UC/CSU A-G requirements with grades of C or better
 - AP: Earn scores of 3 or higher on at least 2 AP exams by the end of 11th grade
 - Career/College Pathway: Complete an approved CTE or NAF pathway by the end of senior year OR complete at least 2 dual enrollment/college credit courses before the fall semester

Students MUST complete all criteria in Section 1, Section 2A, and 1 option from Section 2B.

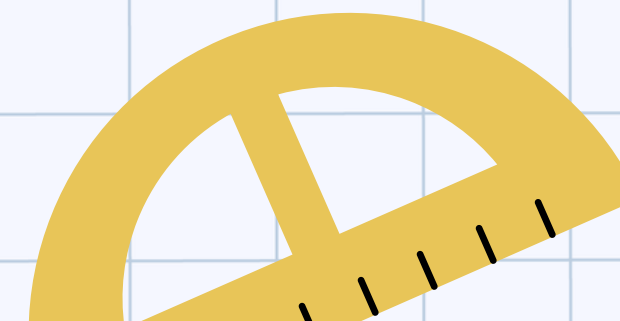
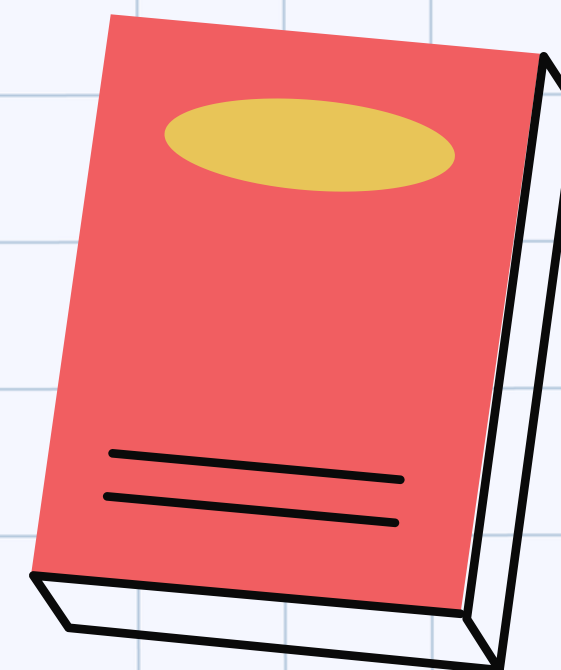
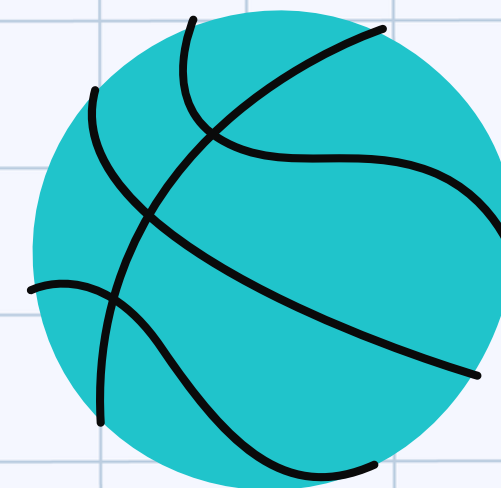
