



Homecoming 2026 Agreement Conditions

As a condition of attending Homecoming, each student and guest agrees to follow this agreement, all applicable school policies, and the directions of school personnel. The administrations of St. John Bosco High School (SJBHS) and Saint Joseph High School (SJHS) retain full authority to admit, refuse admission to, or dismiss any student or guest. A violation may result in denial of admission, removal from the event, school disciplinary action, and loss of the ticket price. **Refunds will not be issued.**

Attendance and Check-In

1. All rules in the applicable school handbook remain in effect throughout the event.
2. Students must attend school on Friday, October 2, 2026, to be eligible to attend Homecoming, unless an absence has been excused and approved by the Administration.
3. Each student and guest must present a valid school or government-issued photo ID and check in before entering.
4. Check-in begins at 7:30 p.m. Students and guests must arrive no later than 9:00 p.m. Admission after 9:00 p.m. may be denied, and a parent or guardian may be contacted.
5. School personnel may inspect coats, purses, bags, and other belongings at check-in. Backpacks are not permitted.
6. Students and guests must remain within the designated event area. They may not leave before the 10:30 p.m. dismissal time. Anyone who leaves the designated area will not be readmitted and may be subject to disciplinary action.
7. A parent or guardian may be contacted if a student does not arrive, arrives after the admission deadline, is denied admission, or is removed from the event.
8. A student bringing a guest who does not attend SJBHS or SJHS must obtain approval through the required guest-pass process before the event.

Attire

Homecoming attire must be tasteful, appropriate for a school-sponsored semi-formal event, and consistent with the student's applicable school dress and grooming standards. The Administration will make the final determination regarding the appropriateness of attire. A student or guest who does not meet these requirements may be denied admission or dismissed.

Girls Attire

- Sleeveless, spaghetti-strap, one-shoulder, strapless, off-the-shoulder, and floor-length dresses are permitted.
- Dresses must be knee-length or longer. Slits may not extend more than four inches above the knee.
- Deep V-necklines, backless styles, exposed midriffs, and attire that reveals excessive skin are not permitted.
- Formal rompers, jumpsuits, and pantsuits are permitted. A pantsuit must include a jacket.
- Jeans are not permitted.
- Girls must arrive in dress shoes. They may bring appropriate flat or comfortable shoes to change into later. Tennis shoes may not be worn at check-in.
- Piercings must comply with the applicable SJHS or SJBHS dress and grooming standards. Cartilage, nose, and lip piercings are not permitted.



Boys Attire

- Boys must wear dress slacks with a dress shirt and a tie, bow tie, or mandarin collar. A suit is optional.
- Dress shoes or appropriate casual dress shoes are required.
- Facial hair must be groomed. No more than one earring per ear is permitted.
- Zoot suits, deliberately mismatched patterns, and excessively bright or distracting colors are not permitted.
- Tennis shoes, topsiders, boots, informal hats, and extreme hairstyles or hair colors are not permitted.

Attire During the Event

Appropriate attire must be maintained throughout the evening. Shoes must remain on, except when changing into approved footwear.

Conduct and Safety

- Students and guests must behave appropriately and follow the directions of faculty, administrators, venue personnel, and security staff.
- Inappropriate dancing and excessive public displays of affection are prohibited. Continued or serious violations may result in removal and disciplinary action.
- Toys, noisemakers, pranks, and throwing objects are prohibited.
- Outside food and beverages are not permitted. Items brought to the entrance may be confiscated and will not be returned.
- Smoking and the possession, use, or distribution of alcohol, illegal drugs, or other prohibited substances are forbidden. If the Administration reasonably suspects that a person possesses or is under the influence of a prohibited substance, the person must cooperate with school procedures, including any authorized search or assessment.
- When warranted, the Administration may remove a student or guest, contact parents or guardians, notify law enforcement, and impose discipline under the applicable school handbook.
- Conduct by a student or guest that violates school policy or brings negative attention to SJBHS or SJHS may result in additional disciplinary action and the loss of eligibility to attend future school activities.
- Students and guests are responsible for their electronic devices and personal property. SJBHS and SJHS, TPE event planners, the venue, and their employees are not responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items.
