KNOW THE STANDARDS

Most disciplinary offenses lead to relatively minor actions such as an office referral, counseling, or detention. However, serious, or repeated offenses may lead to suspension or expulsion.

A suspension is when a student is removed from school for a day or multiple days. An expulsion is when a student is removed from school for extended period of time – up to a year.

WHAT STUDENT BEHAVIORS RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION?

- Willful damage to school property or stealing school property
- Willful damage to personal property or stealing personal property
- Robbery or assault
- Extortion, coercion, or blackmail
- Public verbal abuse that disrupts the school program or incites violence

WHAT STUDENT BEHAVIORS RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION?

- Engagement in "hazing" activities
- Bullying
- Violation of D20 or TCA building policies
- Possessing, bringing, using, or threatening to use a dangerous weapon (including knives) as defined in statute and policy
- Violation of D20's substance abuse policy (alcohol and drugs)

WHAT STUDENT BEHAVIORS RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION?

- Violation of TCA's tobacco-free school policy
- Discrimination/harassment
- Sexual harassment
- Dress code violations
- Violation of TCA's Digital Health Policy

WHAT STUDENT BEHAVIORS RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION?

- Throwing objects that can cause bodily injury or damage property
- Directing profanity, vulgar language, or obscene gestures toward another person
- Lying or giving false information to a school employee
- Scholastic dishonesty, including cheating and plagiarism

WHAT STUDENT BEHAVIORS RESULT IN SUSPENSION OR EXPULSION?

- Making a false accusation of criminal activity against a school employee to law enforcement or the district
- Repeated interference with the school's ability to provide educational opportunities
- Continued willful disobedience or open and persistent defiance of authority

- Behavior on or off campus that is detrimental to the safety and welfare of the TCA community
- Violent or aggressive behavior

HOW DO THE CONSEQUENCES FOR THE DIGITAL HEALTH POLICY WORK?

POLICIES JICJ-TCA-B & JICJ-TCA-R

Students shall not access their phones from the start of classes until the student's day is over ("bell to bell").

- **1st offense:** Student phone is taken to the office; student retrieves at the end of the day.
- **2nd offense:** Student phone is taken to the office; parents retrieve at the end of the day.
- **3rd offense:** Defiance; one-day suspension.
- **4th offense:** Continued defiance; minimum of three-day suspension.

DID YOU KNOW?

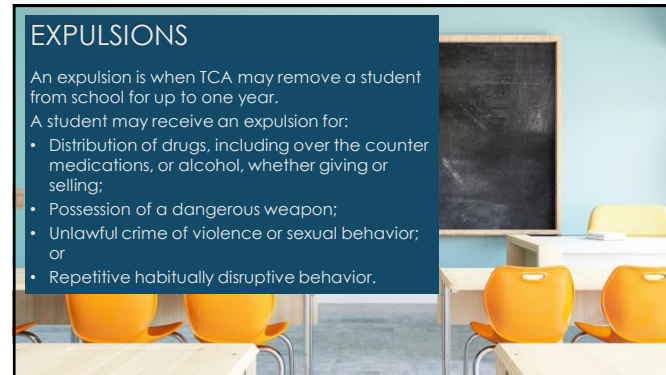
- Vape pens are considered tobacco products and should not be brought to school.
- Having a vape pen, vape refills, or cigarettes on campus is an automatic suspension—including if such products are in your care in one of the parking lots.



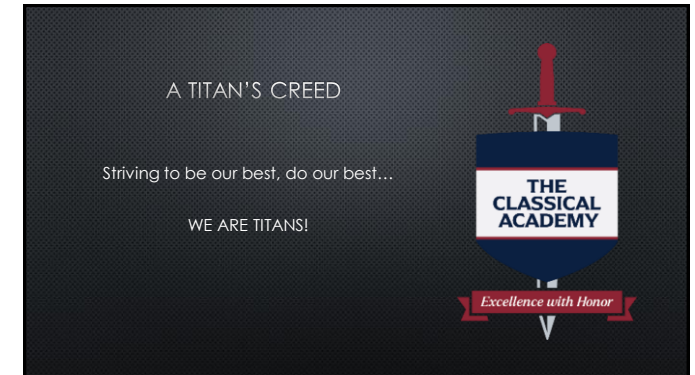
