Grading System

- Grade Point Average (GPA) is calculated at the end of each semester.
- Students receive a weighted and unweighted GPA.
- Honors classes earn one-half extra quality point.
- Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual Enrollment classes earn one extra quality point.

Iredell-Statesville Schools use a 10-point grading scale:

A:	90-100	4.0
B:	80-89	3.0
C:	70-79	2.0
D:	60-69	1.0
F:	0-59	0.0

A weighted GPA is used to determine class rank, honor cord recipients, honor graduates, and NC Scholar distinction.

Iredell-Statesville Schools has moved forward with the Latin honors system as a way to note students of academic excellence.

Based on a student's weighted GPA, the distinctions are:

- Summa Cum Laude: 4.5+
- Magna Cum Laude: 4.0 to 4.49
- Cum Laude: 3.7 to 3.99

While Iredell-Statesville Schools encourages students to earn 28 credits, they can graduate with the state's minimum of 22 credits.

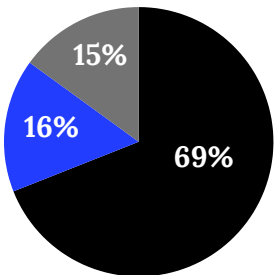

LNHS offers a wide variety of challenging classes. Students may choose academic, honors, Advanced Placement, or Dual Enrollment courses. Offered are 18 core subject honors classes, 153 Dual Enrollment courses in 28 pathways, and 20 AP courses.

Freshmen have two AP classes to choose from; sophomores have six; juniors have fifteen, and seniors may choose from any of the twenty AP courses. Juniors and seniors have Dual Enrollment options with our community college.
