The Curriculum

The intersection of mission and academic life is best illustrated through St. Andrew's participation in the **International Baccalaureate (IB) Programme** — a globally recognized, integrated curriculum encompassing six to eight subject areas that incorporates critical thinking, research, and cross-cultural understanding.

All students in Grades 6-10 participate in the IB Middle Years Programme (MYP), taking courses that span eight subject groups. Once students enter Grade 11, they may choose one of three pathways to graduation. These pathways include completing Diploma Programme (DP) coursework to earn credit for a high school diploma, testing in specific subject areas to achieve an IB certificate designation, or pursuing the full IB diploma.

IB Diploma students are intellectually curious, strongly motivated to work and learn, excited by challenges and the dynamics of academic discovery, and possess an exceptional work ethic. The range of academic offerings at St. Andrew's spans from university rigor to support — from the IB Diploma Programme study to academic support classes in which students learn self-advocacy and management strategies to accommodate specific learning differences.

St. Andrew's uses the semester system and offers half-year and full-year courses. Grade 9 students are enrolled in eight courses, including a semester of Design and the Arts. Grade 10 students also enroll in eight courses but take a full year of Design and the Arts. Students in Grades 11 and 12 are enrolled in seven courses. Postgraduates are enrolled in four courses and participate in an internship. Courses are 80 minutes in length and meet two or three times per week.



Honor Roll & Honor Societies

Honor Roll

Honor Rolls are published quarterly. To achieve Academic Honors, students must have a grade point average of 3.25-3.66 for the quarter, with no grade lower than a C-. To achieve Academic High Honors, students must have a quarter grade point average of 3.67 or above and no grade lower than a C-. We also recognize that effort and conduct are essential to a student's success; therefore, students who receive Excellent and Good grades for effort and conduct in all classes are recognized on the Effort Honor Roll, which is published quarterly.

National Honor Society

Beginning in Grade 10, students can apply for membership in the National Honor Society, provided they maintain a 3.5 GPA and demonstrate 25 hours of volunteer/leadership experience. Students are invited after the first quarter and inducted in a winter ceremony. Once inducted, students must maintain a GPA of at least 3.5, participate in community events, volunteer, and avoid disciplinary action to remain in good standing.

National Art Honor Society

The purpose of the St. Andrew's School Chapter of the National Art Honor Society is to inspire and recognize students who have shown outstanding ability in art, foster excellence and a dedicated spirit to the pursuit of art, advance creative skills and talents of the Society's members, bring art to the attention of the school and community, and further aesthetic awareness in all aspects of the school's total program. Students in Grades 9-12 can earn induction throughout the year by maintaining a 3.0 GPA in all classes, completing 4 hours of visual art service through community service projects, and participating in bi-weekly meetings.

Chapin Leadership Program

The Chapin List is our most celebrated student leadership association. Selection is based on a rigorous application process and the evaluation of the entire faculty and staff. Appointment involves formal and informal responsibilities, and it grants special privileges.

Academic Program Requirements

Each year-long course is awarded 1 credit, and each half-year course is awarded 0.5 credits.

Twenty-six credits are required for a diploma and must include:

- 4 credits in English
- 3 credits in Mathematics
- 3 credits in History
 - including 1 in U.S. History
- 3 credits in Science
 - including 2 in Lab Science
- 2 credits in World Languages
- 2 credits in Physical Education
- 2 credits in Arts
- 7 elective credits
 - including participation in the IB Core and completion of the Personal Project



Participation in the DP IB Core

All students participate in the IB Core as a graduation requirement, completed throughout grades 11 and 12. Exemptions are made for those students who enroll at St. Andrew's as Grade 12 or Postgraduate students. The IB core consists of a Creativity, Activity, and Service (CAS) Project, an Extended Essay, and a Theory of Knowledge course.

Project Exhibitions

Personal Project Exposition

All Grade 10 students complete an independent personal project. These are rooted in personal passion and driven by a commitment to service to the community. Students must produce a product, a research paper, and a reflection. Students present projects to the community in February.

Theory of Knowledge Exhibition

As a part of their Theory of Knowledge (TOK) course, Grade 11 students curate an exhibition of three objects that demonstrate how TOK concepts manifest in the real world. They present and exhibit their work in May.

Postgraduate Program

Partnership with Syracuse University

St. Andrew's has partnered with Syracuse University's Project Advance Program. Through this partnership, each Postgraduate student will take a college-level writing course called Practices of Academic Writing, taught by a St. Andrew's faculty member using Syracuse University's curriculum. Additionally, all Postgraduate students will take an Introduction to Entrepreneurship course. Students will receive college credit upon successful completion of each course.

Internship Opportunities

All Postgraduate students complete an internship during the second semester of their postgraduate year. This provides students with essential real-world skills to complement their classroom work and support their success beyond St. Andrew's.

Special Program Highlights

Service Learning

Since its founding, St. Andrew's has been deeply committed to service learning and giving back to the local and global community. Because completing the IB core is a graduation requirement, all students are expected to dedicate time to serving others. Throughout the academic year, all community members participate in service leadership projects. These projects allow students to lead and benefit our local and global community. They are integrated into our school curriculum through seminar classes in Grades 9 and 10, the Personal Project, and the CAS Project.

Middle School Requirement: Grades 6-8 students participate in at least (3) school-sponsored service projects. They maintain an active service folder that includes completing reflections after each service experience.

Upper School Requirement: Grades 9-Postgraduate students participate in at least (3) school-sponsored service projects. They engage in a variety of service experiences during the first quarter before choosing a single organization to complete at least five (5) additional service experiences. Students maintain an active service folder that includes completing reflections after each service experience.

Co-curricular Offerings

SAS students must participate in a co-curricular program for two of three seasons, although many students choose to participate in all three. Interscholastic teams include: squash, basketball, cross country, golf, track & field, crew, lacrosse, tennis, and soccer. Students may also participate in biking, intramural tennis, ski club, pickleball, performing arts productions, musical bands, dance, yearbook production, and the literary magazine.

The Arts

All students in Grades 9 and 10 participate fully in the Arts Program, taking advantage of offerings in theater, dance, music, and visual arts. Once they enroll in Grade 11, our students may select from IB visual arts or any of our other arts electives, described above. Co-curricular offerings, including the performing arts, are also a vibrant part of the program.

Learning Support Program

At St. Andrew's, individual and group academic support is regularly scheduled in classes. Students who access learning support receive accommodations to assist with differentiated learning styles. This helps students understand their learning strengths and differences, enabling them to access the content taught in their classes.
