Strategic Plan Goal	Through the creation of a standing Innovation Committee, produce an annual report to the Board of Control with recommendations regarding curricular and alternative instructional delivery changes that will continually keep the Tech Campus at the forefront of best practices in curriculum and instructional delivery.
SMART Goal	By May 30, 2027, the standing Innovation Committee will meet at least six times and present its inaugural annual Innovation Report to the Board of Control containing recommendations for at least three pilot instructional delivery models pilots which may include flexible scheduling, hybrid or blended instruction, intensive or condensed courses, evening/weekend programming, off-site or employer-based instruction, interdisciplinary programming, or other innovative delivery approaches.
Success Metrics	• The Innovation Committee established and conducts at least four meetings during the 2026–2027 school year. • The committee reviews opportunities for cross-curricular programming, emerging instructional practices, alternative delivery models, new or expanded programs, and operational innovations relevant to CTE and workforce preparation. • Identify and evaluate at least three significant innovation opportunities, including potential benefits, implementation considerations, resource requirements, and anticipated impact on students and programs. • Develop and implement at least three pilot programs, with district support, utilizing alternative instructional delivery models. These models would be for implementation in the 2028-2029 school year. Pilots may include flexible scheduling, hybrid or blended instruction, intensive or condensed courses, evening/weekend programming, off-site or employer-based instruction, interdisciplinary programming, or other innovative delivery approaches.
