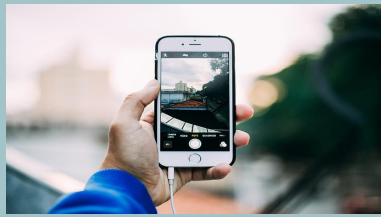
Mock Trial Club

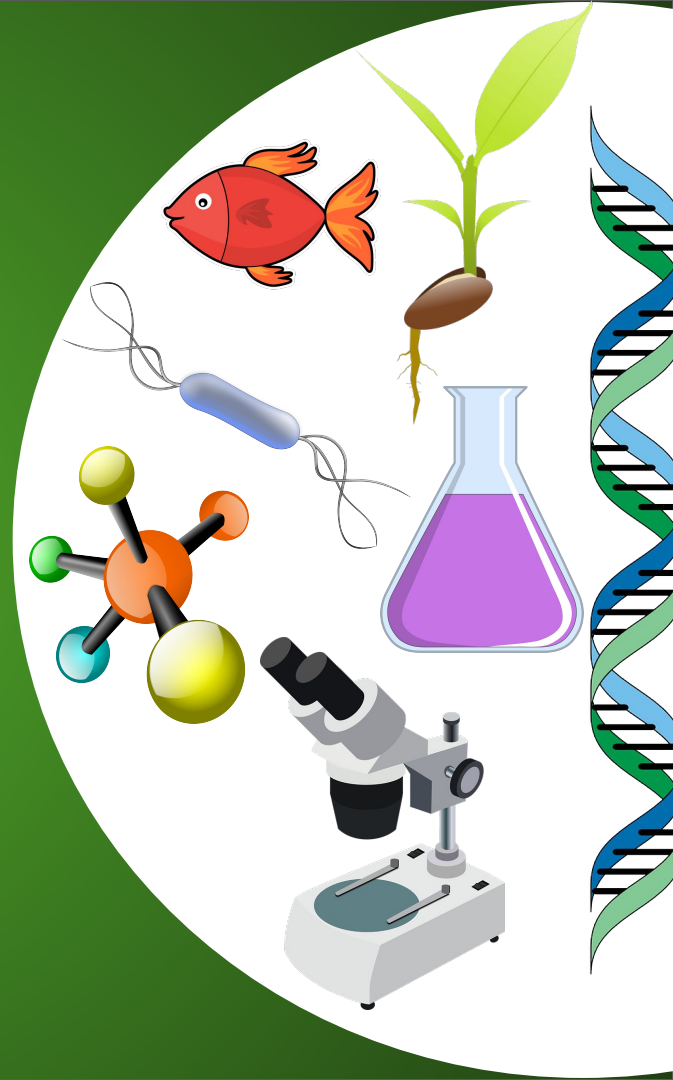

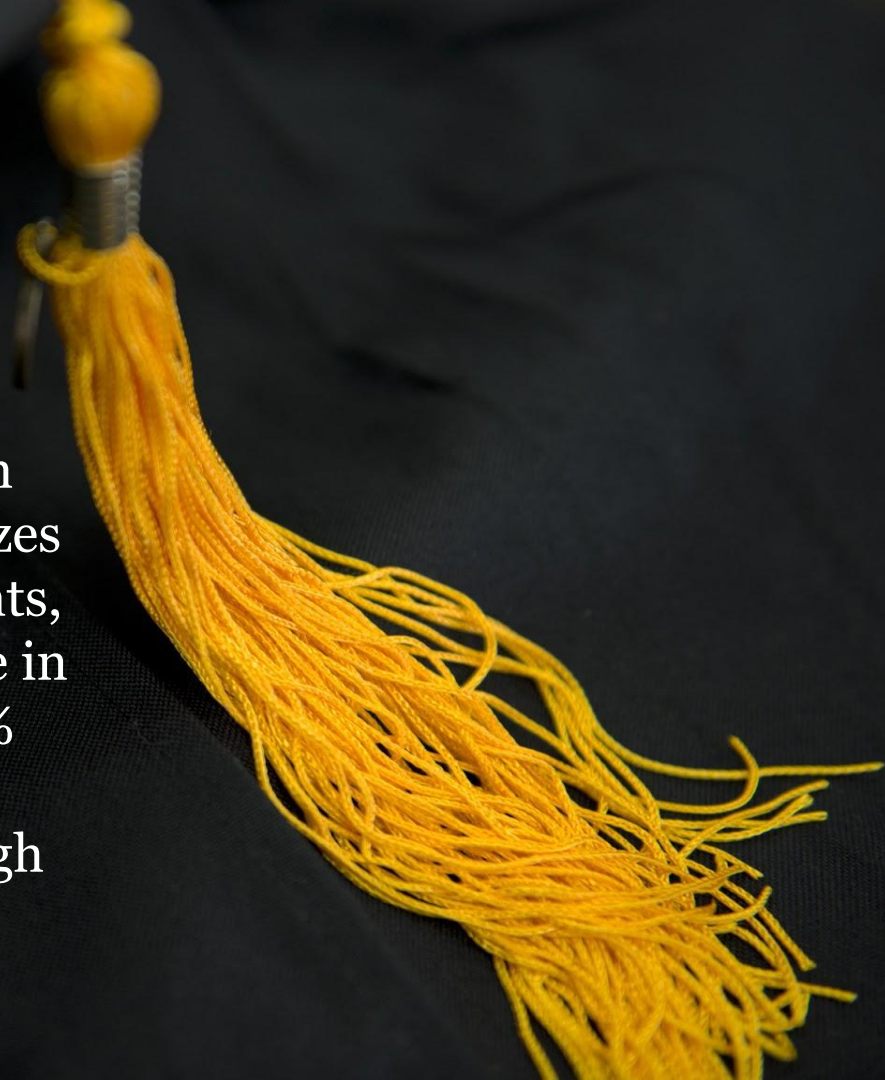

Business and Marketing Honor Society

The primary purpose of the Business and Marketing Honor Society of New York State is to recognize students who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in business education at the secondary level.

Eligibility

- * Students must be currently enrolled in at least one business education (fall and/or spring) course
- * Seniors: Must complete 3 units in Business Education by the end of the current school year
- * Sophomores/Juniors: Must complete 2 units in Business Education by the end of the current school year and should be planning to enroll in at least one additional unit prior to graduation.

Criteria

MINIMUM CRITERIA

In Business Education courses: Minimum average of 88 percent, which is a B+ or 3.5 GPA and an overall average of: 80 percent, which is a B or 3.0 GPA

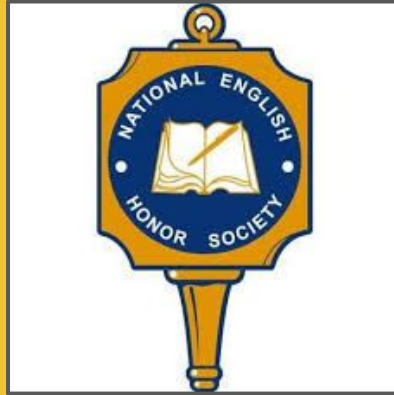
