

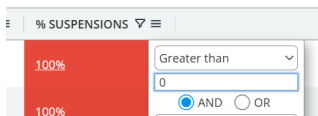
Manual Calculation for the California Suspension Rate Metric

The California Suspension Rate Metric divides the number of students who have at least one day of out of school suspension by the total number of enrolled students (including withdrawals and drops). For Aeries districts, this metric pulls enrollment data from the DAY table in Aeries, which is updated individually by sites. This means the enrollment data in this metric may not be completely up to date at all times. However, a quick manual calculation can provide an updated percentage:

1. Find the “Out-of-School Suspension Rate” metric card on the Suspension Usage Dashboard.



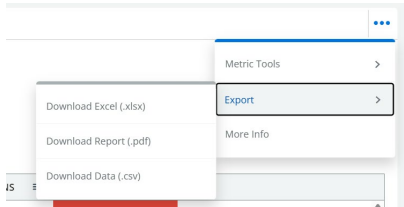
2. Drill into the metric. Filter the column “%Suspensions” greater than 0. This will return any student with at least one day of out of school suspension.



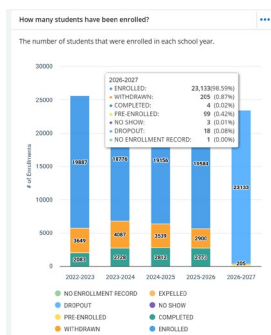
Total of 2,988 row(s) with a row limit of 60,000.

Note that the total number above the table will not change when the column is filtered.

3. Once the table is filtered, count the total number of students who have at least one out of school suspension. If the number is small, it can be counted directly from the table. Another option is to export the filtered table as an excel or csv file and get the count from there.



4. Once you have the number of students with out of school suspensions, go to the Enrollment Overview dashboard. Use the “How many students have been enrolled” metric to get the total number of students who have been enrolled to date in the district. Hovering over the 26-27 bar will show totals for your district’s various enrollment records. In general, you will add up all records except those that indicate a student never truly enrolled, such as “No Enrollment Record” or “No Show.” Alternately, you can get a YTD enrollment count directly from Aeries or your district or site Aeries administrator.



5. Divide the total number of students who have been suspended (step 3) by the total number of enrolled students (step 4), and the resulting percentage is the CA Suspension Rate.
