- **Financial Aid for College: Tuesday, September 29: 6:30 p.m. Leadership Center:** Parents of juniors and seniors are encouraged to attend this presentation by Yvette M. McGhee, Assistant Dean of Financial Aid at Prairie State College. She will talk about financial aid for college and completing the Free Applications for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). - **Required Student Health Forms for Freshmen and Seniors!** A reminder to our freshman and senior parents that if you have not yet turned in your student's required medical forms, **the absolute deadline for submitting these documents is Monday, September 28, 2026.** Reminders have been sent home with your student over the past few weeks and mailed home if we are missing any of these documents. If you cannot have the forms completed by this date, you must contact our school nurse with the date of the medical and/or dental appointment. **Failure to meet this deadline will result in your child being excluded from school beginning on Thursday, October 1, 2026.** **Freshmen:** Health Physical (with immunizations), Dental Exam, Eye Exam (Indiana residents only for eye exam). **Seniors:** Proof of MCV Vaccine. Please make sure documents contain the signature of a parent/guardian as well as the designated medical professional. Forms can be turned into the Main Office during regular business hours (7:00am-3:00pm) or scanned and emailed to our school nurse: kmckinney@marianchs.com). If you have any questions, please contact our school nurse, Ms. Kathy McKinney, at 708-755-7565, ext. 1779, or email her. Thank you for your cooperation and commitment to the health of your child and our school, as the health and well-being of our students is of the utmost importance.
- **Tardiness to School** We have noticed an increase in the number of students arriving late to school in the morning. Please be sure to leave early enough so that when students arrive on campus they have ample time to be in their first period class before the final bell rings at 7:45 a.m. When students arrive late to class, whether to first period or any other class during the day, it is disruptive to their classmates, teachers, and the learning environment. After a third tardy to school per semester, disciplinary consequences are imposed. **Tardy to School:** Students are to be in the school building by 7:40 a.m. and report directly to their first period class. Students are to be in their first period classroom when the second bell sounds at 7:45 a.m. **Disciplinary Consequences of Tardiness to School:** There are two types of tardies to school: excused or unexcused. An excused tardy to school must include a doctor's note or a parent phone call. **Any tardy after the 3rd tardy will be unexcused even if the parent calls the student in late. Students with three (3) unexcused tardies to school per semester will receive a detention.** For unexcused tardies from four (4) to seven (7), students will receive a Saturday work detention which includes a \$25 fine. A student who receives eight (8) unexcused tardies in a semester will be placed on an Attendance Probation contract. Students on Attendance Probation may be withheld from participating in field trips, dances, and/or extracurricular activities for the remainder of the semester. Continued tardiness will require the student to meet before the Discipline Board. **Tardiness to Class:** Students are to be in the classroom when the bell sounds. A tardy to class in excess of ten minutes will be considered an unexcused absence. Whenever a student is tardy to class, the teacher records the tardy. A general detention is issued upon the fourth tardy to class per semester. A student who continues to be tardy may be placed on an Attendance Contract and/or may be referred to the Discipline Board. Complete policies can be found on page 20-21 of the policy handbook.
- **Drop-Offs for Students:** Parents are reminded that items dropped off for students during the school day are highly discouraged and will only be accepted for emergency situations such as eyewear, cell phones (if they will need it to contact home after school/practice), iPads, and IDs. These items must be left with the security officer at the Main Office entrance for distribution to the student. Deliveries and drop offs for students during the school day such as headphones, earbuds, lunches, food, school assignments, flowers, gifts, DoorDash, Uber Eats, etc. will not be accepted. This will encourage student self-responsibility. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation!
- **Dropping Off Students at School in the Morning:** A reminder to parents and students, that in the morning, students should be dropped off on the Joe Orr Road side of campus (Door 20-Spartan Shop or Door 14-Circle Drive). Students should not be dropped off at the Main Office entrance before 8:00 a.m. Please [click here](#) for a brief video about student drop off and pick up. Thank you for your cooperation!
- **Required Parent/Student Policy Handbook Information Review:** All parents/guardians are required to review a digital copy of the Marian Catholic policy handbook prior to the first day of school. Students will receive a hard copy of the handbook/planner along with their class schedule. Parents and students are responsible for being aware of all of the information contained in the handbook. Your counselor will send you a SmartPass to meet with them in the counseling office, so be sure to check your email every day before your Study Hall to see if you received a Smart Pass. **If you last name begins with letters A through K, your counselor is Mr. O'Farrell; if your last name begins with the letters L through Z, your counselor is Ms. Dundek.**
- **Cell Phone Reminder:** Students, just a reminder that all cell phones should be placed in the cell phone pouch in each classroom at the beginning of each class period. **Cell phones are not to be used during instructional/class time. If you leave the classroom at any time during class (e.g. have a Smart Pass to go to the washroom), you are to leave your cell phone in the classroom pouch.** You are allowed to use your cell phone at lunch time in the cafeteria. Thank you for your cooperation!
- **After School Tutoring:** is available today from 2:30-3:15 p.m. in the Bracha Center (in Dominican Way). After school tutoring is available from 2:30-3:15 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Friday. If you have any questions, please see Ms. West in Counseling.
- **Lunch in the Leadership Center:** Here are some reminders about lunch in the Leadership Center. You must have your student ID to purchase food in the cafeteria. If you do not have your ID yet, you should show your ID through PowerSchool or SmartPass. You must have a positive balance in your MealTime account to purchase food. Students can now add funds directly to their MealTime cafeteria account at the cafeteria register before school or during your lunch period using any of the following payment methods: Cash, Check (made payable to Country House Kitchen Co.), Credit or Debit Card, or Apple Pay. Payments made with credit cards (online or at the register) will incur a credit card processing fee. Funds must be deposited to accounts prior to 9:00 a.m. to appear in the account that day. All payments made at the cafeteria register will be applied directly to your MealTime account. **Any food purchased in the**

Leadership Center must be consumed while in the Leadership Center. All students must eat lunch in the Leadership Center and are not permitted to eat lunch in any other area of the school (Library, Band Room, etc.) or any classroom. You will not be permitted to take food out of the Leadership Center. Thank you for your cooperation. Students, you may also bring your lunch from home if you choose to not purchase cafeteria food. There are two microwaves in the cafeteria for student use; please make sure any food is in a microwave-safe container. Students who use the microwaves are responsible for cleaning up any splatters or spills; paper towels are located nearby. Please also take a minute when you are finished with lunch to clear your table and dispose of any trash in the proper trash/recycle receptacle. Please place any plastic trays on the carts that are provided near the trash cans (please do NOT throw the trays away). Thank you!

- **Main Office Hours During the School Year:** Monday through Friday, from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Please feel free to call the office with any questions you may have at any time.
- **Dress Code Reminder:** A reminder to parents and students that the Marian Catholic Dress Code has changed to **Khaki only** pants, shorts, and skirts. Dress code Khaki pants must be the traditional cut or relaxed fit chino-style or Dockers-style, cotton twill, knee-length Khaki chino-style shorts, or knee-length Khaki skirts. - **Student Drop Off and Pick Up:** All students should enter the building through Door 14 (Circle Drive), or Door 20 (Spartan Shop) which are off of Joe Orr Road. Students should be dropped off by 7:30 a.m. so that they have plenty of time to be in their first period classroom before the second bell rings at 7:45 a.m. Students are not to enter the school building through the Main Office (Door 5) prior to 8:00 a.m. At dismissal, all students should be picked up from the Joe Orr Road parking lot only. - **Spartan Shop Hours:** Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, Friday: 7:30 - 10:00am and 1:00 - 3:00pm. The Spartan Shop is closed on Wednesdays. Please enter at Door 20 (Joe Orr Road).
- **MealTime Accounts:** Once a MealTime account has been established, food purchases are made using the student's bar-coded Student ID card. Students must have a positive balance in their MealTime account to be able to purchase food in the Leadership Center (cafeteria). You may continue to use MealTime to add funds to your student's account online, view your student's account balance, and monitor their cafeteria purchases as you have in previous years. **New this school year:** Students can now add funds directly to their MealTime cafeteria account at the cafeteria register before school or during their lunch period using any of the following payment methods: Cash, Check (made payable to Country House Kitchen Co.), Credit or Debit Card, or Apple Pay. Payments made with credit cards (online or at the register) will incur a credit card processing fee. Funds must be deposited to accounts prior to 9:00 a.m. to appear in the account that day. All payments made at the cafeteria register will be applied directly to your student's MealTime account, giving your family even more flexibility and convenience. Students may also bring their lunch from home if they choose to not purchase cafeteria food. There are two microwaves in the cafeteria for student use; please make sure any food is in a microwave-safe container. Students who use the microwaves should take the responsibility of cleaning up any splatters or spills; paper towels are located nearby. If you experience any problems with MealTime on-line, please call their help number at: 1 800-755-0904. [Click here](#) for instructions on how to set up your MealTime account.
- **Tuition Policy:** Thank you to all of our families who are in full participation with the FACTS system and are current with their tuition payments. As a reminder, during the school year, if any family misses three payments or is not in full participation with the FACTS system, the student will be disenrolled from Marian Catholic High School. This means that the student will not be allowed in class nor will they be able to participate in any extracurricular activities. If a family is behind in tuition payments or not in full participation with FACTS, and they are receiving a scholarship or tuition assistance, in addition to the late payment fee any scholarship and/or tuition assistance they are receiving will be reduced by 1/10th for each monthly payment that is missed. This means that the amount owed to Marian Catholic will increase. Please make sure your FACTS account is set up and your tuition payments are current. **On September 1, 2025, the fee for credit/debit card transactions increased to 3.05%. An alternate payment method such as ACH, is available at no additional cost.** If you need assistance, please contact Mrs. Harrison, our business manager, at: mharrison@marianchs.com so she may assist you.
- **After School Supervision:** All students not leaving school at 2:20 PM and not a part of a club or athletic team, must wait for their ride in the Leadership Center. A study hall atmosphere is maintained, and the concession stand is open until 3:30 PM if students want to purchase snacks or beverages. If students are with a team or club after 2:45 PM, and need to come to the LC to wait for their ride, they must obtain pass from the coach or moderator in order to enter the Leadership Center. After 2:45 PM, students should inform their parent/guardian to pick them up at Door 21 (Leadership Center ONLY). Once students leave the Leadership Center they are not permitted to wander around the school or reenter the building. **After School Supervision is also available on Early Release Thursdays and all of the above-mentioned policies apply on early release Thursdays.**
