The District has contracted with school messenger to provide notification services in the case of weather emergencies. Parents were given information on the system during registration. Please call the elementary office for any contact information updates. The school district will also post delays and cancellations on our Facebook page and web site.

If there are special restrictions placed upon bus transportation or delayed starting of school, this information will be broadcast. In the event school closure is anticipated a day in advance of the occurrence, the above radio/TV stations will broadcast this information in the evening hours. Should all bus transportation be canceled, school will be closed for all students regardless of their place of residence.

Breakfast: If school is delayed, breakfast will be canceled for the day.

Dangerous Weapons Policy

It is a violation of state law for any person to carry a firearm or dangerous weapon on school premises, school-provided transportation or areas of other facilities being used exclusively for school activities. The law outlines exceptions in certain cases, i.e., security activities, firearm safety lecture/course, law enforcement officers, etc.

School officials shall notify the appropriate law enforcement agency of known or suspected violations of this policy. Students who violate this policy shall be subject to discipline, including a one-year expulsion for a violation involving a firearm.

Physically harms a student or damages the student's property or has the effect of substantially interfering with a student's education or is so severe, persistent or pervasive that it creates an intimidating or threatening educational environment or has the effect of substantially disrupting the orderly operation of the school.
