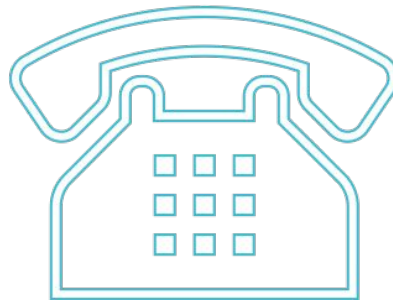

English – 4 credits required

Math – 3 credits required

Science – 3 credits required

Social Studies – 4 credits required

PE – 1.5 credits required

*Each season of a school sport gives a .25 PE Waiver. Two PE waivers are needed to check off one .5 credit box. If PE waivers are used, the same number of boxes will need to be added in the elective rows. PE waivers do not grant credit, but rather waive the PE requirement.

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Elective – 7 credits required

If you take more than the required credits for Eng, math, sci, soc, or PE, add those credits to the elective boxes.

22.5 total credits are required for graduation



-Transcript-

- You can view your unofficial transcript through Q/Parent/StudentConnect.
- An official transcript may be needed for personal use, scholarship applications, or to be sent to colleges or other institutions.

- SAT/ACT – If you have not already taken one, sign up as soon as possible – more details on following slide.
- Be sure to enter ERHS's code **(020368)** when you sign up for the SAT/ACT. This allows your scores to be sent to the school district. (Required for APS)
- SAT/ACT fee waivers are available to students who qualify for free/reduced lunch. Please contact your counselor or apply directly online.

ASVAB & Practice SAT/ACT



- ASVAB at ERHS will be Friday, 10/30 and Friday, 2/26
 - Starts at 9:00am with interpretation immediately after.
 - Students should plan to be here for about 3 hours.
 - Sign up form for the ASVAB is in the Curriculum Office, or see Mrs. Witte in A225.
- Frontier Tutoring will offer FREE VIRTUAL practice SAT and ACT tests:

-Letters of Recommendation-

- If you would like to request a letter of recommendation, please complete the “Request for Letter of Recommendation” form and submit it to the requested author.
 - [Printable Link HERE](#)
 - Check with the person you are requesting a letter from, because they may have their own process or form they prefer.
- Make sure to allow enough time (usually 2 weeks) for recommenders to write your letter. Plan ahead now!





-College Applications

- Narrow down the schools you want to apply to
 - If you are not able to visit prospective schools in person, check out the many virtual tours available online!
- Look at application deadlines and requirements
 - Plan ahead – deadlines are often late November, early December.
- If asked by the college/university, it is a good idea to waive your right to see counselor/teacher recommendations (FERPA waiver).
- If you apply through Common App/Send EDU/or other similar site, please let your counselor know, so we can make sure your recommendations are complete.

Add counselor in Common App: navigate to the "My Colleges" tab, select a specific college, then go to the "Recommenders and FERPA" section. Complete the FERPA waiver if you haven't already, and then click "Invite and Manage Recommenders". From there, you can invite your counselor by entering their email address.

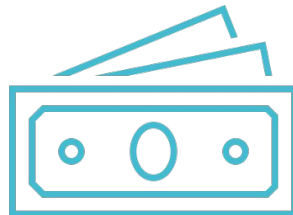

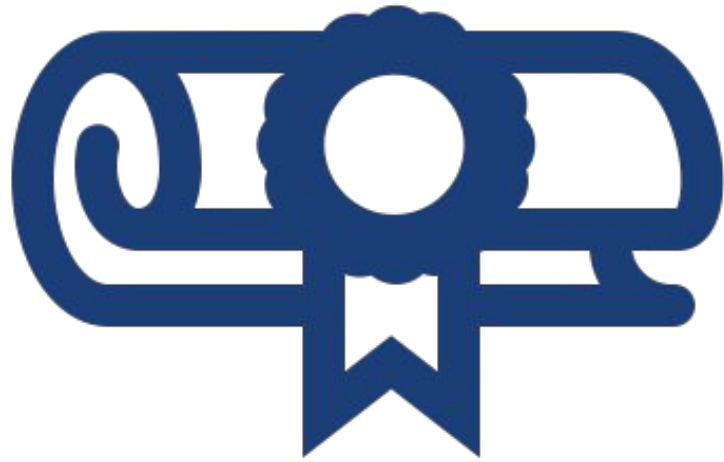
-Scholarships-

ALASKA PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIP CHECKLIST



To receive the APS and other forms of financial aid, students must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) by **June 30th** of each year. Visit studentaid.gov

REQUIRED CURRICULUM

Contact your counselor for information about APS courses. Approved courses may also be available through resources such as the University of Alaska or others. Eligibility is determined based upon courses with a letter grade reflected on your official high school transcript.

ALASKA PERFORMANCE SCHOLARSHIP

- Up to \$28,000!
- Great Plan A or B
- Available for 8 years after graduation
- No competition - you only need to complete eligibility requirements and the FAFSA to earn the scholarship
- Qualify by completing required classes and earning a high enough GPA or test score
- Can be used at universities and many technical and training programs in Alaska ([see list here!](#))
