Academic Spotlight

NH Envirothon State Competition



The Timberlane Regional High School Envirothon team placed first in the NH Envirothon State Competition on May 19th, 2026. NH Envirothon is a state competition in which students are evaluated on their skills and knowledge in four categories: soils, aquatic ecology, wildlife and forestry. During the competition, teams of five students worked collaboratively, independent of their teacher advisors, to address an environmental issue and present a solution to a panel of experts. Three teams represented Timberlane this year and presented their projects researching the impact of non-point source pollution on a pond in their neighborhood, exploring how everyday actions can have far-reaching impacts on water quality, ecosystems, and community health. All three teams represented well and one of our teams, comprised of TRHS students Ava Sawyer, Alexa Ring, Jacob Tiney, Jonathan Castricone, and Lexi Dowling, took first place. As a result of this win, this summer the TRHS Envirothon will be sending five students to compete at the national level in the National Conservation Foundation Envirothon Competition hosted by Mississippi State University. There they will compete with teams from all 50 states and provinces of Canada. Good luck to our Owls as they move on to the national competition!

All interviews were transcribed utilizing voice to text so that the transcripts can be utilized by high school staff and students to further support the curriculum.

I think projects like this where high school students get to see the towns we come from and what they mean to the people who have been here is really important."
